What is Guide Camp Skills?

This event is designed to teach the youth camping/outdoor skills and to have fun! The units will be sleeping in tents and participating in organized activities. The Guides will rotate through stations including tent care, outdoor cooking, fire safety, games, hiking, compass and first aid. The activities are planned and facilitated by the Calgary Area Camping committee and other volunteers.

Units will be sharing tent sites with other units.

Everyone needs to meet at **Camp Jubilee – designated Drop Off site and a time will be assigned on March 18, 2024**. Please ask your Unit Guider for this information before the event. Pick up on Sunday will be at the same as the drop off site. Please try to carpool with other participants to reduce the amount of traffic on site.

CAMP KIT LIST – PERSONAL KIT LIST

This is a list of things that each camper will need for the adventures at this event. These are general guidelines and a minimum of what the Guides need to have for the weekend. Leaders, please add to this as you see fit for your unit. Some of these items will also need to be taken in the daypack for the event. Please see the Day Pack kit list for specifics of what needs to be packed.

Label all bags with:

- Guide's Name
- Unit Number IE: 1st Calgary Guides (Check with your unit what this should read)

All gear should be waterproofed and packed in a large backpack or duffle bag. Large suitcases are not suitable for this kind of camping as they are not waterproof.

You can waterproof bags by packing everything in a garbage bag and putting that into your bag.

Guides should aim for one Gear Bag and one Bed Roll ([How To Roll a Bedroll](#)) and one Day Pack

Focus on layering clothing to keep warm.

Please ensure that EVERYONE is **dressed for the weather** so that all the Guiders and Guides at the event can have a wonderful experience.

Due to Alberta's ever-changing climate, we strongly recommend dressing in layers. We will be in the mountain foothills, so the temperature can drop rapidly throughout the evening. The list below is what Guides should WEAR OR BRING in a knapsack.

KIT LIST FOR TENT CAMPING

PLEASE PACK INTO A BACKPACK,

ALL ITEMS MUST BE LABELED

AND THE GUIDE MUST BE ABLE TO CARRY HER OWN GEAR. DO NOT PACK ANYTHING IN PLASTIC BAGS (i.e. Green garbage bags, orange, or other bags).

SLEEPING ITEMS (bedroll)

- Warm Sleeping bag, (not a Barbie style)
- Self-inflating mattress or thin blue foamy (not air mattress or air beds)
- 6' x 8' tarp
- 6 meters of ¼" rope
- Warm Blanket
- Small Pillow

PERSONAL ITEMS

- Tee-shirt with sleeves, (no tank or spaghetti straps) – 2
- Warm hoodie or sweatshirt - 1
- Underwear – 2
- Socks - 4
- Shorts – 1
- Long Pants (no jeans) – 1
- Warm jacket - 1
- Raincoat - 1
- Sturdy running/walking shoes or hikers (no fashion shoes, sandals) - 1 pairs
- PJ's (2 piece) - warm - 1
- Rubber Boots - 1 pair
- Sun Hat (covers head/ears/neck)
- Winter Toque and gloves

PERSONAL HYGENE ITEMS (packed in small makeup bag)

- Toothbrush & paste
- Personal hygiene products
- Hairbrush and hair ties (**hair will be always tied back**)
- Kleenex
- Small towel
- Face Cloth and soap
- Sunscreen & Bug Spray (unscented)
- Small cup

OTHER ITEMS

- Mess Kit – (unbreakable (metal or heavy plastic) dishes, plate, bowl, metal cutlery in a mesh bag) not paper or plastic picnic
- Camp Chair or sit upon
- Day Pack
- 1 - Water Bottles - 1 litre - filled.
- Book to read.
- Camera
- Flashlight with spare batteries
- Small Stuff
- Note paper and pen or pencil
- **Clean empty Tuna/Salmon Can**

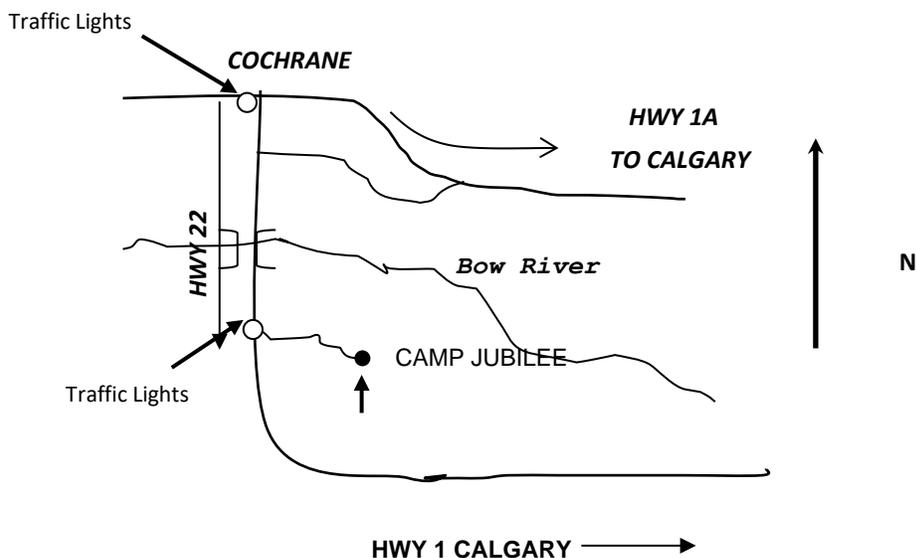
DO NOT BRING ON TRIP ANY **ELECTRIC ITEMS, I.E. IPODS, MP3 PLAYERS, ETC.** DO NOT BRING ANY FOOD OF ANY KIND, BADGE SASHS, AND SCRAVES ETC.

ANY MEDICATIONS MUST BE IN THEIR ORIGINAL PACKAGING WITH WRITEN INSTRUCTION OF DOSAGE. PLACE ALL THE MEDICATION IN A ZIPLOCK BAG AND LABEL. (to be handed in to the Unit First Aider)

LOCATION: 255240 and 255242 Rge Rd 42. Legal Land Description W1/2, Sec 34, TP 25, R4, W5M.

DESCRIPTION: Approximately 85 acres located on the south bank of the Bow River immediately east of Hwy. 22.

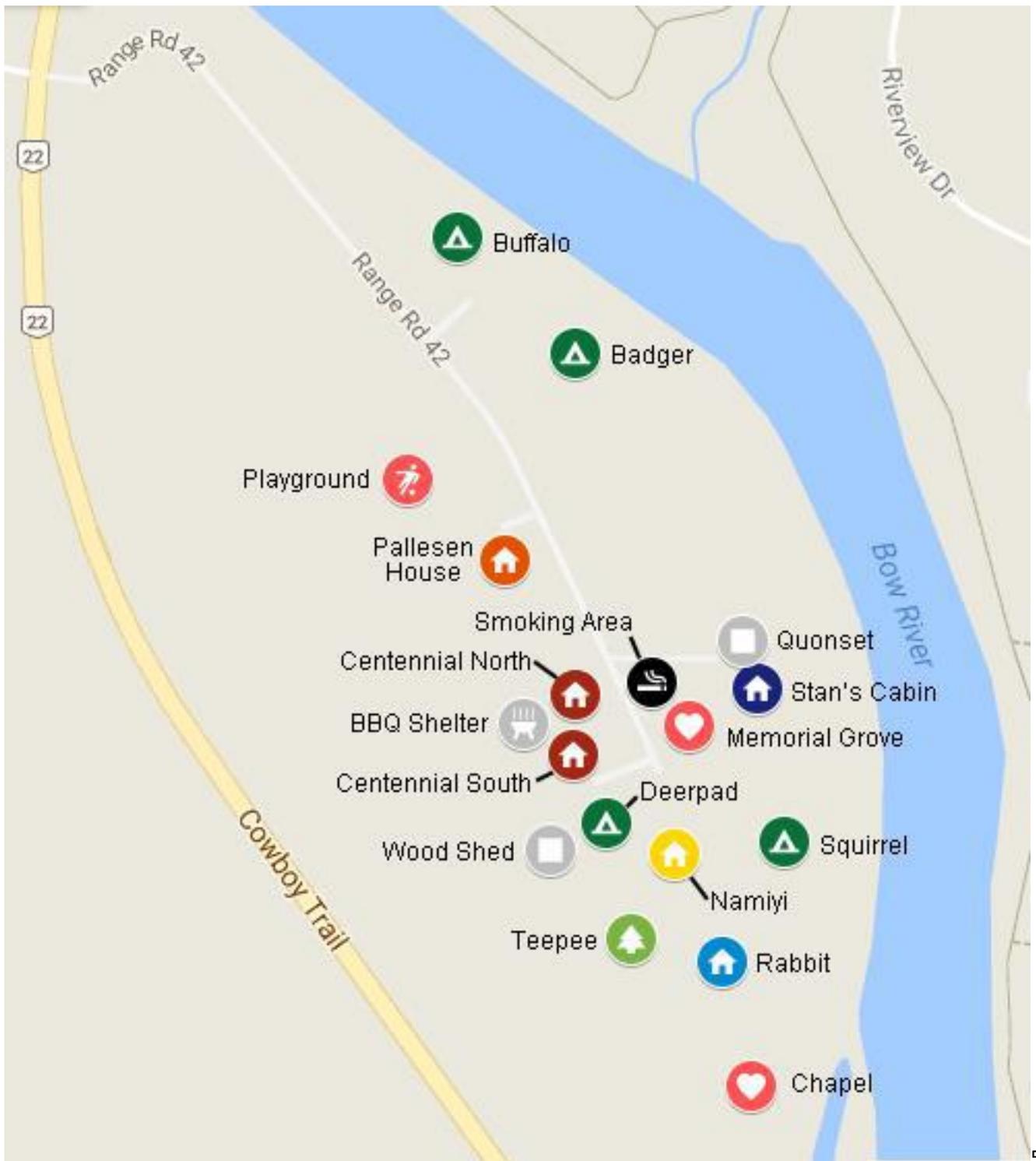
TO REACH CAMP:

Access from the South: From the junction of Hwy 1 and Hwy 22, travel north on Hwy 22 to the town of Cochrane. At the second set of lights turn right onto the gravel lane.

Access from the North: From the junction of Hwy 1A and Hwy 22 in the town of Cochrane, travel south on Hwy 22. The entrance is on the Southeast side of the bridge, across from George Fox Trail at the fourth set of lights; turn left onto the gravel lane.

Remember the Speed Limit is 15 km/h; your children are on site!!
