

Unit kit list

- Registration confirmation number – have it ready to pick up your package at the registration desk.
- Small first aid kit
- Pop up shelter
- Banner (see below for details)
- Extra snacks if needed
- Health forms with girls' pictures attached (H1 and H2)
- Fuzzy socks for service project craft (one pair per girl participant)
 - Each district in attendance will be invited to take a percentage of the service project crafts back to their districts to distribute to such organizations in need (e.g., women's shelters, children's charities, etc).
- Plastic ID pouches for each participant
 - Cue cards and markers to make name tag for inside plastic ID pouch (for younger

participants, it is recommended that the back of her name tag include the unit name, leader name, and leader's contact number at the event)

- Place a copy of each participant's health form with a picture in the pouch as she needs to have one on her at all times at the event.

Address

The event is located at Cowichan Exhibition Park, 7380 Trans-Canada Hwy, Duncan, BC V9L 6B1. Participant registration and entrance to the event will be located at the main gates. You will be directed to the registrations tables after your whole group has arrived and you are able to enter as a complete group.

Parking

We also encourage people to carpool to help reduce congestion during drop-off and pick up at the event. The map below shows the full area of the Cowichan exhibition grounds. We have rented area number three. As you arrive designated parking attendants will give you directions on exactly where to park. Buses are asked to drop off and then park at the nearby Wal-Mart parking lot (3020 Drinkwater Rd, **Duncan**, BC).



Opening/Closing

- Units can begin picking up their registration packages at 10:30. All of your participants need to be accounted for and ready to enter together – staggered entry will not be permitted.
- There will be Pathfinders on site available to assist with setting up shelters if needed. The event ends at 3:30. Be prepared for traffic congestion and agree on a pick up spot for your parents prior to the event.
- It is our intention to have an opening once all participants have arrived and have picked up their registrations. If all runs according to schedule, opening will commence at 11 a.m. This is flexible and subject to change.

All things food/drink related

- We will have water stations available around the site rather than just in one location. · Girls should arrive at the event with a full water bottle
- We will be encouraging girls to fill up 8oz at a time so that everyone will have ready access to hydration.
