Travel Assistance Guidelines

There will be a prorated travel assistance provided for participants. Assistance with travel costs is available in accordance with the following guidelines:

Travel for vehicles with 4+ participants will be paid .50cents/km

Travel for vehicles with 3 participants will be paid .40cents/km

Travel for vehicles with 2 or less participants will be paid .30 cents/km

Drivers will be required to complete a mileage reimbursement form at onsite registration and will need to list all participants traveling in their vehicle including all their IMIS numbers to be compensated.
