Saturday

Units arrive at after 2:00 pm to register at AYR Motor Center headquarters, 105 Connell Park Road, Woodstock. Use lower driveway next to Racetrack and Dog park.

Unit sets up camp and has supper prior to Opening Ceremony at flagpole. Campfire follows.

Girl Teams present at AYR headquarters at 7:30 pm to start the overnight hike ending at midnight along a mapped out route. Project challenges provided by local service groups and Guiding individuals are in 3 sections between Connell Park, AYR Motor Center and Ys Mens Club.

Challenges are based on Girl Guide programming meant to be fun and promote team work. Girl Teams are scored at each Project Challenge. After completing all Project Challenges and Amazing Race (Pathfinders) each girl team is to sign out at AYR Headquarters before going back to camp site for the night.

Sunday

Knights of Columbus Hall 143 Charles Street, Woodstock, NB - Sunday morning a warm breakfast is provided along with plagues/awards presented to 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners of Guide and Pathfinder girl teams, Amazing Race Pathfinder and Shianne DeLong award. ***Unit guiders are responsible for arranging travel for unit girl members to and from Knights of Columbus Hall. Distance is to far to walk. After breakfast it is back to campsite for site teardown and clean up prior to travelling home.

Note - There is the option to arrive a day early to tent on Friday night at the campground, 120 Connell Park Road, Woodstock, NB, making this a 2 night outting. Unit Guiders are responsible for additional Safeguide paperwork and arrangements.
